

### Y7 Catch Up Fund Statement 2018/19

Outwood Academy Foxhills identify catch-up students using KS2 SATS outcomes; any child achieving less than the expected standard of 100 in English and/or maths is entitled to catch up support with the aim of closing learning gaps. We also identify students using the reporting system Praising Stars © who are not making required progress in English and/or maths and require some further support. As such the Academy reserves the right to allocate Year 7 Catch-Up Fund to support any students or groups of students the Academy has identified as needing additional support in English and/or maths to achieve their outcomes in learning. In allocating this fund consideration will be given to those students who: Have not made the required progress in reading, language and/or maths at Key Stage 2; Praising Stars © shows that they are currently not making the required progress; further psychometric assessments are carried out if further information is needed to identify if a child has a SEND need. This is part of the SEND code of practice where early identification is of paramount importance.

In 2018/19 academic year, Outwood Academy Foxhills received £17,839 in Catch-Up Fund, in 2019/20 we expect to receive the same funding.

A wide range of provisions and intervention strategies were offered to enable learners to engage in learning and do their best. In 2018/19 this funding was used towards Accelerated Reader, Lexia session, Lucid assessments, targeted enrichment, VMG literacy and numeracy activities supported by whole school training, individual learner behaviour interventions, 1:1 and small group nurture interventions and a proportion of Teaching Assistant salaries. Impact has been measured by progress made by Praising Stars © 6 and the expected GCSE outcomes, increase in reading age and teacher feedback.

#### 2018/19 Impact of Catch-Up Fund

##### Maths Impact

47% of the maths catch up students are now predicted to attain at least a grade 4 in maths GCSE. 20 students require further intervention.

##### English Impact

54% of the English catch up students are now predicted to attain at least a grade 4 in English GCSE. 22 students require further intervention.
