

Completing your COVID lateral flow home test

- Clean and dry the area to be used to complete your test
- Clean your hands for 20 seconds using soap and water
- Collect all of the equipment that you will need for 1 test



- Snap open a vial of testing solution and squeeze all of the contents into your extraction tube



- Locate where your tonsils are (or where they were if you have had them removed) and swab both tonsils firmly 4 times each using the brush end of the swab



- Place the same swab into both nostrils (about 2.5cm deep), swab firmly each nostril in circles 10 times



- Place the swab immediately into the extraction tube swab end into the solution, lift the extraction tube out of the holder and squeeze the bottom of the tube with the swab still in it for 15 seconds



- After 15 seconds remove the swab whilst still squeezing the bottom of the extraction tube and place the used swab in a plastic waste bag provided. Press the cap tightly onto the extraction tube.



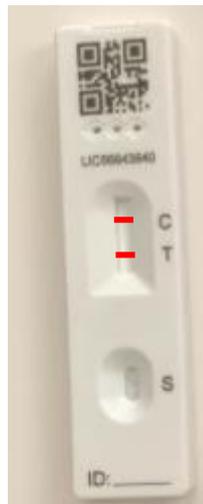
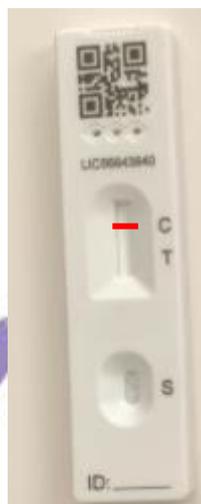
- Squeeze 2 drops of the solution into the specimen well of the test strip. This is the single well marked S, and then place the extraction tube into the same plastic waste bag.



- Record the time, wait for 30 minutes (no longer) to record the results of the test



- Look at the test strip to check the result of your test. The results you may see are below:



NEGATIVE

Continue to follow COVID rules

POSITIVE

You and your household must isolate following Government guidelines. Book and complete a PCR test. You MUST inform school of this result

VOID

The test has not run correctly; complete the full test again using a new test kit. If you receive 2 void results in a row you must have a PCR test

- You need the QR code , or the ID number under it on the test strip to report your results

Report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result

Use this service to report your result to the NHS after using a rapid lateral flow test kit to check if you're infectious with coronavirus (COVID-19).

A rapid lateral flow test is a coronavirus test you do yourself. It shows you the result on a handheld device that comes with the test.

Report the result:

- every time you use a rapid lateral flow test kit
- as soon as possible after you get the result

You cannot report a result after more than 24 hours.

You can only report one result at a time.

Before you start

To use this service, you need:

- the barcode on the test strip or the ID number printed under it (the test strip is the part of the kit that shows your result)
- a mobile phone number so we can text you to confirm we've got your result.

Report by phone

You can also report your test result by calling the phone number in your test kit's instructions.

- Work through the questions, we would suggest setting up an account if you do not already have one, as this makes the reporting easier for future tests.
